555 **Kevin Segall, DC**

556

557 Dr. Segall asked the board if his scope of practice allows him to use Cone beam CT-
558 imaging technology typically used in dentistry. Dr. Segall advised that it provides a lot of
559 diagnostics information with a lower radiation dose and is FDA approved. Mr. Harris
560 advised that licensee may ask for a declaratory statement if they would like a hard,
561 binding opinion by the board. Dr. Hunt advised that an opinion by Paul Lambert (General
562 counsel for Florida Chiropractic Association) is that CT is within scope of practice.
563

565

566 Dr. Miller addressed 2013 question regarding use of mild hyperbaric oxygen therapy. Dr.
567 Miller asked if his scope of practice allows him to use the chamber. Discussion ensued.
568 Mr. Harris advised that discussion by the board would be a non-binding opinion. Mr.
569 Harris advised that the licensee may ask for a declaratory statement, but that it needs to
570 be in much greater detail.

571 **Michelle Champion**

572
573 Ms. Champion addressed CE petitions regarding the 60-day requirement and speaker
574 change and would like the issue addressed with CE Broker. Ms. Champion asked the
575 board to consider adding a procedure to the rule regarding change of speaker and
576 emergency situations. Ms. Champion mentions that there was a mistake in the October
577 2018 board meeting minutes—Line 839 and Lines 843-45. Ms. Champion testified that the
578 statement made was by another doctor and not Dr. Warner. Ms. Champion was aware of
579 who it was but did not disclose. The board directed staff to amend the minutes.

587 training and to research EEDS (Electronic Education Documentation System- similar to
588 CEBroker).
